

- As part of the ongoing 'National Sanitation Campaign', a 'Cleanliness Drive' was organized at ICAR-Central Institute for Women in Agriculture (ICAR-CIWA), Bhubaneswar, during 25<sup>th</sup> July-15<sup>th</sup> August, 2015. As part of it, the following activities were carried out;
- Awareness campaigns on hygiene and sanitation were organized at two Villages viz., Kamaninga and Binjharpur in Dhenkanal district in Odisha on 25<sup>th</sup> July 2015. The programmes were organized as part of the Scientists-Farmers Interface Meetings under the Collaborative Project on 'Livelihood and Nutritional Improvement of Tribal Farmwomen through Horticulture'. In both the places the farm families were sensitized about *Swachh Bharat Mission*, and awareness was created about hygiene, sanitation and prompt disposal of household and farm wastes.

- A mass cleanliness drive was conducted at ICAR-CIWA premises for two hours on 14<sup>th</sup> August, 2015, which started with a sensitization on hygiene and sanitation among the staff on upkeep and cleaning of office premises including common areas, weeding out of old files, records, banning the use of polythene, recycling of waste materials etc. All the regular and contractual staff members numbering about 45, actively participated in the programme, and cleaned the Institute's premises. Further, they were also sensitized to give renewed attention to devote a minimum of 100 hours per year of his/her time exclusively for the 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyan', by participating in the regular cleanliness drives organized for two hours on every Saturday, in the Institute's premises.
